"What's the difference between 1d6 and 2d6 ballpark cards?"

Our **1d6 cards** were our original ballpark card design. They are the same size as our regular batter and 6x6 pitcher cards (about 3.5"h x 2.5" w).

They work by rolling **one six-sided die (1d6)** and checking the ballpark card on any batter card shaded squares, to see how the ballpark influences the final play result.
